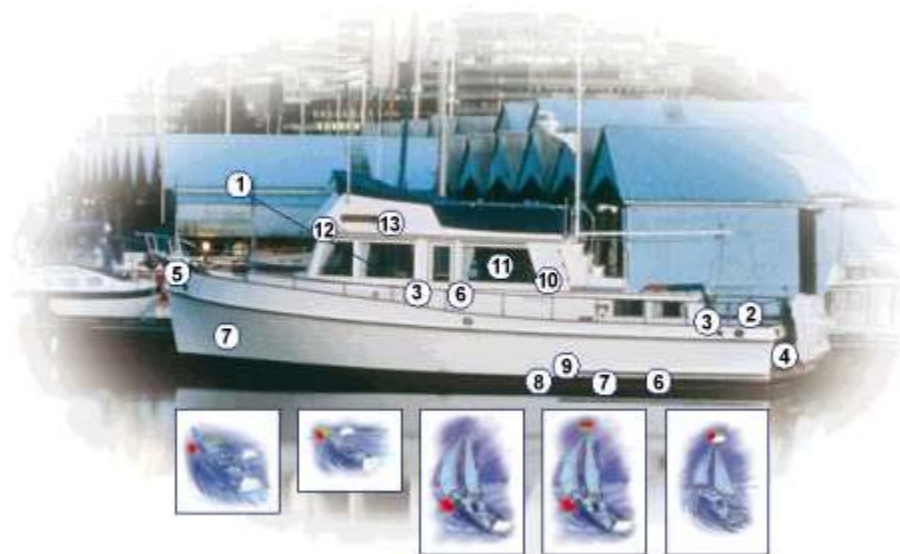

**12 M - 20 M Pleasure Craft
(over 12M in length but not over 20 M in length)**

(including unpowered craft)



minimum required safety equipment

	<p>Personal protection equipment</p> <p>1. one Canadian-approved personal flotation device or lifejacket of appropriate size for each person on board</p>
	<p>2. one buoyant heaving line of not less than 15 m in length</p> <p>3. one approved lifebuoy with an outside diameter of 610 mm or 762 mm that is equipped with a self-igniting light and is attached to a buoyant line of not less than 15 m in length</p>
	<p>4. a reboarding device</p>
	<p>Boat safety equipment</p> <p>5. an anchor with not less than 50 m of cable, rope or chain in any combination</p>

	<p>6. bilge pumping arrangements</p>
	<p>7. one Class 10BC fire extinguisher at each of the following locations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ at each access to any space where a fuelburning cooking, heating or refrigerating appliance is fitted ▪ at the entrance to any accommodation space ▪ at the entrance to the engine room space
	<p>8. 1 axe</p>
	<p>9. 2 buckets, each with a capacity of 10 L or more</p>
	<p>Distress equipment</p> <p>10. a watertight flashlight</p>
	<p>11. 12 Canadian approved flares of Type A, B, C or D, not more than 6 of which are of Type D</p>
	<p>Navigation equipment</p> <p>12. 2 sound-signalling appliances (bell and whistle)</p>
	<p>13. navigation lights that meet the applicable standards set out in the Collision Regulations</p>
